LENTEN GRACE AND EASTER HOPE

"He did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage... And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled himself..."

Philippians 2:6-8

As we read further in Philippians chapter 2, St Paul reminds us of how Jesus, although fully God from eternity, entered our world as a human being. This is something we also remember during Advent, that Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us. During Lent however we focus more on how Jesus completely surrendered himself, identifying with all the struggles and realities of humanity and that this took him to the cross, so that we might know God's gift of eternal life.

St Paul also tells us in this chapter that a focus of Christian life and pilgrimage is that we should constantly work towards our relationships reflecting the same attitude as that of Jesus in humility and looking out for the needs of others. This is a hallmark of Lenten preparation and discipline, working for the common good in seeking to make the world a better place. And as we travel through the discipline of the Lenten pilgrimage, we look to the hope of Easter as the resurrection demonstrates how Jesus is the centre of all things, reflected in the words of verse 9:

"Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name"

With the rising of the sun on Easter Sunday, we light the paschal candle from the fire in reflection of Jesus' resurrection and the new life that we have in him. We look to the future in celebration of the light of Christ that shines in the darkness, and the hope and promise of eternal life in him. **Wishing everyone a grace filled Lent and a blessed Easter and we look forward to welcoming you to our Holy Week and Easter services at All Saints' Crawley Down and St Leonard's Turners Hill.**

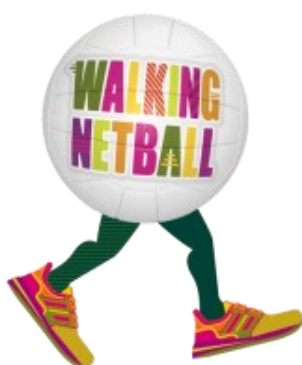
We are a small group of ladies who play Walking Netball each week.

ANCIENT EGYPT

During the Spring term, **YEAR 4** have transported themselves back thousands of years to discover what life was like in Ancient Egypt. The children started the topic by taking part in an archaeological dig, seeing what they could discover about Ancient Egypt from the objects they uncovered from the sand.



A little further into our learning journey, Year 4 arrived at school as either Egyptians or explorers to take part in a history workshop with Lauren from 'Portals from the Past.' The children all looked incredible! Over the course of the day they discovered more information about pyramids, Egyptian jobs, the life of a pharaoh, religion and lots of gruesome facts about mummification!

Here's what some of the Year 4 children had to say about the day:

Once they knew more about mummification, Year 4 designed and made a canopic jar each. They had to mould the clay very carefully to ensure it was sturdy, whilst still carefully following their designs. We had some brilliant parent helpers supporting us with this and the finished jars were just fantastic!

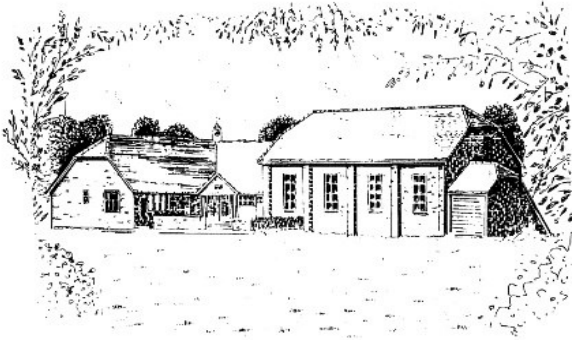

ROADS & SPEEDING IN TURNERS HILL

The Parish Council applied for a 20mph zone for the crossroads and the roads leading to it. This was unfortunately rejected, mainly because additional engineering work is required in order to bring current speeds down. The Highways Authority has agreed to look into what engineering works are required, so that we can reapply in the future with a clearer understanding of what is required.

The Parish Council does not have any authority to make changes on the roads, but it continues to work with the Highways Authority to attempt to make the roads safer and slower.

KEEP YOUR MONEY SAFE - WHAT TO DO IF YOU THINK YOU'VE GIVEN REMOTE ACCESS TO A SCAMMER

- Switch off both the device and your wi-fi connectivity
- Speak to your bank as a matter of urgency
- Remove the relevant app from your list of recent downloads or installed programs, check for other programs that may have been installed remotely
- Change your email and online banking passwords and, where possible, enable two-factor authentication
- If you have security software, ensure it has all new and recent updates – then run a full security scan

**REPAIR
CAFÉ** Forest Row

Meet Forest Row Repair Café's "can-do" ceramics repairer – Fran Rawlinson



When broken items are brought to Forest Row's Repair Café in pieces, Reception invariably says, "Ask Fran!", knowing this will give those items the best chance of repair. "I'll have a go at anything" she says.

Although Fran Rawlinson is known for seamlessly resurrecting broken ceramics, she's fixed chairs, glass ornaments, wooden cases, picture frames, jewellery – and she's seen her fair share of valuable pieces, including a Martin Brothers vase worth four figures, a William Moorcroft jardinière and a fabulous Casa Pupo lamp.

"It's why I love it – because of the joy it gives people to have something that's precious to them mended. It's very rewarding."

To Fran, repairing is "simple" – though anyone who's attempted to glue back together broken treasures, only to find the final piece doesn't fit, or nothing aligns, will know this isn't the case. For Fran, though, who says she "was blessed with spatial awareness", it's like a "3D jigsaw puzzle – and I love puzzles."

Fran believes she inherited her mother's handiness, having been raised on a farm watching her lay a brick path, say, or work wonders with wood: "She was good at everything." Fran would "sit at her elbow" and learn – her first project was to make a hamster cage out of wood and chicken wire (admittedly, it chewed its way out).

After art college and a career in graphics, Fran kicked against the computerisation of her craft, and instead did a course in china mending. Lacking the patience of a museum-grade restorer, she says, she sees repair as a hobby, volunteering at no less than three Repair Cafés each month – Chailey, Forest Row and Lindfield, leaving her just one free weekend.

Fran was also painting from a young age, and you may well see her with a paintbrush at the Repair Café, because, "quite often, when I put things back together, there are little pieces missing." She closes this space with filler, then paints over it in a perfect, hand-mixed colour match: "It's not good enough for me for it just to be in one piece."

Frankly, we're lucky the museums didn't get her.

Worth Parish Council Update

We would like to extend a warm welcome to Colin Botterill, who has joined our Grounds Maintenance Team. Colin and Shane, our Grounds Maintenance Supervisor, will be busy in both villages. So, if you see either of them, please say hello.

Following much discussion with West Sussex County Council, we have now received confirmation that we can proceed with our plans to introduce **new parking spaces at Bowers Place**, with some amendments. We will now arrange for further drawings to be completed to support a revised planning application and a Section 278 Agreement (the legal agreement required with West Sussex County Council to make changes to the public highway), and you will have a chance to share your views as part of the planning application process.



There is currently no progress to report on the installation of **CCTV** in the Parish whilst wayleaves and connectivity issues are being resolved. However, we hope that this will be resolved shortly and dates for installation agreed. The four proposed cameras will be monitored in the Control Room of Sussex Police. In Copthorne they will be located by the Recreation Ground and the Village Green; and in Crawley Down, by the Play Area and on the corner of Burleigh Way.

This initiative is to support the prevention, investigation and detection of crime, the apprehension and prosecution of offenders, the maintenance of public order and the
