We're on the home straight of 2020 and what a strange and challenging year it has turned out to be.

As I write, in the middle of the second lockdown of the year, it's unclear what our Christmas celebrations might look like. The pessimists are predicting Christmas may be cancelled altogether. Bah Humbug!

But is it possible to cancel an event which has already taken place? The first Christmas happened over two millennia ago. The birth of Jesus, Emmanuel, which means "God with us" was God's plan for humanity; a plan which enables anyone and everyone who wishes to, to have a living relationship with God. That first Christmas, Jesus, the Christ-child, came down to earth from heaven (as a popular carol reminds us!). He is the light that shines in the darkness as chapter 1 of John's Gospel reminds us. At the time of writing they are awaiting a weatherproof coating and are therefore still covered; it is expected that they will be uncovered before Christmas.

YOUTH CLUB

We hope everyone is keeping well and getting used to the "new normal" at school. The Youth Club Team would normally be looking forward to celebrating Christmas with some Christmas activities but unfortunately everything in the year 2020 is different due to the coronavirus.

Although there are plans in place to eventually re-open the Glebe Centre, having looked at both government guidance and the guidance from the Diocese of Chichester, the Youth Club team feel that we would be unable to provide an experience for the Youth Club members that would be both safe and enjoyable. We would only be able to have a maximum of 15 Youth Club members, they would need to wear a mask and keep two meters apart at all times, no tuck shop would be allowed and there could be no loud music or shouting. The whole point of the Youth Club is for the members to socialise and relax in an enjoyable and safe environment, which is just not possible at the moment.

The Youth Club team hope that life will become a little bit more normal in the not too distant future, and that we will then be able to re-start our meetings when we can run normally, or with minimal restrictions in place.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CDRA

What a year 2020 is turning out to be, the ongoing pandemic is affecting everyone's lives both at work and at home – often meaning the two become one as people work from home where possible. We wanted to take a moment to update you all on what the CDRA have been up to in these interesting times.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Whilst things have gone a little quiet this year with our normal events being cancelled the CDRA have continued meeting and working to try and help our community. In particular, the CDRA launched the Crawley Down Support Network (CDSN) during the first lockdown which helped numerous people access shopping, medication, and basic supplies whilst isolating – this was a great success and the CDRA could not have done it without the amazing army of volunteers that stepped forward to help run it.

The CDRA have considered whether the CDSN should resume for Lockdown 2.0. Given the lockdown restrictions are not so tight, and shops and services are better prepared to deliver supplies to customers, the decision has been made to not operate the CDSN. This decision will be kept under constant review.

Defibrillator

For many years, the Council-owned defibrillator has been located inside the McColls. This has now been relocated to a special cabinet on the wall outside Flanagan's Butchers to make it more accessible in case of emergency.

It has been registered with South East Ambulance Service, so if you were to ring 999 you would be directed straight to it. Opening the cabinet is via a keypad, to deter

vandalism, but the ambulance service will be able to tell you the code.

Thanks to Glen Holland from Audio Visual Installations who installed the cabinet for us, and of course to Les Flanagan who gave permission for it to be put on his wall.

Competition Guidelines and Rules

The competition is open to all residents of Worth Parish.

Entries must be prepared by 4pm on Friday 18th December 2020. All lights must then be on from 4pm to 8pm from Friday December 18th to Monday 21st December 2020, during which times judging will take place.

All displays must be visible from the road; the judges will not enter your property

Prizes will be awarded for Winner (£50) and Runner Up (£25) in each village; these will be announced on the Council website on Tuesday, 22nd December, with successful households being notified directly.

Displays will be judged on the following criteria, with a maximum of 100 points available:

First Impression	-	25 points
Design	-	20 points
Originality	-	20 points
Suitability to Site	-	15 points
Creativity	-	20 Points (environmental elements including recycling, energy conservation, etc. will also be taken into account)

There is no fee for entry but an entry form must be completed and submitted by 9am on Friday, 18th December to ensure that the judges know where to go!

General rules of entry

- Worth Parish Councillors and staff are not eligible to enter this competition.
- The address for the display must be residential; businesses are not eligible to enter.
- Prizes will be paid in cash, direct to the winner/runner up, when photographs will be taken.
